We are officially entering, what we hope to be the most magical time of the year and the busiest time in our school calendar.

Our whole school community have embraced our new JIGSAW theme 'Celebrating Difference' and are exploring those themes alongside our British Value 'Mutual Respect'. We continue to drive our cultural capital with Charity work and trips outside of school and hope to share with you soon our plans for the Spring Term.

For the remaining part of this half term we are trialling a new timetable for our longer playtimes. We have unfortunately been unsuccessfully in our bid to recruit lunchtime staff and so we are finding new ways to adapt and promote positive play and social eating times. All children are invited to the hall to eat together at the start of our lunch hour. Children are then encouraged to play on our main playtime until the hall is closed for service and we are sure that everyone has had an adequate amount of time to eat. After this point we split our school into House groups (Hawks, Eagles, Kestrels and Falcons) and divide our play across the main playground and Small/Tennis court Playground. This allows a broad age range of children to socialise and mix together and offers more space and variety across the school site. Children then come back together in class groups at the end of play and for all other break times, offering a good variety of social opportunities across the day. So far, we are really enjoying the new timetable and are seeing positive impacts on behaviour and citizenship during these times. We will review our new approach after Christmas and then make any adaptations needed.

Thank you to Mr Bishop for helping to organise our Y4 and 3s to honour the fallen of Lympsham.


