Impact Wide variety of extra-curricular activities organised throughout the term with consistent change in child groups to include; netball, basketball, cross country, tennis, football and cricket. Overwhelming response from children to be included in groups with waiting lists on a weekly basis. CS actively supported School competitions (HSMS) although this proved tricky on the day's fixtures clashed with responsibilities at East Brent C of E Academy. Full quota of after school sports supported with additional children from Year 3 / 4 wishing to take part.
